Dr. Dickson's professional career has been devoted to the neuropathology of degenerative disorders, particularly those that produce dementia and Parkinsonism. He is the neuropathologist for the Mayo Clinic Alzheimer Disease Research Center and the Center Director for the Udall Center for Excellence in Parkinson's Disease Research. He directs the brain bank for the State of Florida Alzheimer Disease Initiative and the Society for Progressive Supranuclear Palsy. He received B.S. (Biochemistry) and M.D. degrees from the University of Iowa. He was awarded the Metropolitan Life Award in 2001 and the Potamkin Prize from the American Academy of Neurology in 2011. He was awarded the Fred Springer Award from the American Parkinson Disease Association in 2008 for his contributions to the neuropathology of Parkinson's disease, and the Alfred Meyer Award from the British Neuropathological Society in 2009. He is past president of the American Association of Neuropathologists and editor of a monograph sponsored by the International Society of Neuropathology, now in its second edition, entitled "Neurodegeneration: The Molecular Pathology of Dementia and Movement Disorders."
